THE CITY OF LAKE FOREST WTP RECEIVES APWA AWARDS

GURNEE, IL – March 18, 2006 – The City of Lake Forest, Illinois Water Treatment Plant Membrane Rehabilitation Project continues to impress winning two more awards from the American Public Works Association (APWA). Constructed by Joseph J. Henderson & Son, Inc. of Gurnee, IL, the Water Treatment Plant Membrane Rehabilitation Project, a first for Illinois, received honors from both the Lake Branch and the Chicago Metropolitan Branch in the Environmental Division, \$10-\$100 Million category. The building was built within a sedimentation basin and contains eight new ultrafiltration units. The design incorporated future expansion including skylights and floor openings large enough to get new ultrafiltration units into the building. The plant, which provides water of outstanding quality and purity for the residents of Lake Forest, was completed on-time and under the City's budget. It occupies an incredibly small footprint for the volume of water treated, 14 million gallons per day.
